

## **Renter Rights Mandatory Disclosures**

To ensure that all Minneapolis renters can learn more about the places they call home and their protections and resources, the Minneapolis City Council passed the Renter Rights Mandatory Disclosure ordinance in August 2024. Ordinance no. 2024-028 amends MCO 244.2000 of the Housing Maintenance Code to set a new standard for transparency in renting.

The ordinance requires property owners to:

- Provide some information about the rental building before signing a lease with a potential renter, and
- Other information within 90 days after a lease starts

This document lists all the information that rental property owners or managers must share. Property owners should add their contact information below and can share this document with renters to comply with this ordinance.

## Information to share before signing a lease

Any renter who does not receive the following information before signing a lease can end the lease after giving proper notice to the property owner. The time of the notice must be as long as when rent is due or three months, whichever is less.

- The property's rental license tier status
- Any housing code violations that contribute to the tier status
- All open orders to correct and violations at the property
