The goal is to sponsor a series of events in 2018 where local professional experts provide training or technical assistance on topics that help entrepreneurs, particularly those that have been underrepresented, take their businesses to the next level.

## Why is the City creating this program?

We believe that our city has vast professional talent, innovation, and creativity that can benefit our small business community. We want to tap into the innovative ideas of those professionals that respond to the needs of entrepreneurs. We want to provide more specialized assistance beyond that offered in the core B-TAP program and to an expanded audience of businesses.

### How it works:

The City of Minneapolis is piloting this call for ideas from local professionals and technical assistance providers. Responders will propose an idea for some sort of technical assistance for businesses that responds to a need that they have and if selected will have to deliver it in a short timeframe. Awards vary from \$2,500 to \$7,500, depending on the level of detail and impact in the target population. Up to <u>five</u> ideas will be selected.

#### **PROFESSIONAL SERIES GOALS**

- Support the development of businesses with high potential so they can advance to the next level and create additional employment.
- Respond quickly to specific market needs or opportunities that address the well-being of Minneapolis entrepreneurs and small businesses.
- Support the development of minority, women, and low-income owned businesses.

#### **HOW IT WORKS**

The City of Minneapolis is piloting this call for ideas from local professionals and technical assistance providers. Responders will propose an idea for some sort of technical assistance for businesses that responds to a need that they have and if selected will have to deliver it in a short timeframe.

#### AWARD AMOUNT

Responders will have a short timeline to implement their idea. Awards vary from \$2,500 to \$7,500, depending on the level of detail and impact in the target population.

The training and technical assistance is targeted at, but not limited to, the following audience:

- Small and medium-sized businesses
- Minority and women-owned businesses
- Businesses with traction ready to advance to the next level

#### PROPOSAL DEADLINE

#### TIMELINE:

RFP Opens: November 17<sup>th</sup>, 2017
RFP Deadline: January 5th, 2018

Selection and Notifications: January 15<sup>th</sup>, 2018

• Contracting: January, 2018

Idea Implementation: 2018 (to be scheduled)

<u>Proposals received after the deadline will not be accepted</u>. It is neither the City's responsibility nor practice to acknowledge receipt of any proposal. It is the responder's responsibility to assure that a proposal is received in a timely manner. Please make sure your proposal is complete. Incomplete proposals will not be accepted.

#### **SELECTION PROCESS**

The ideas will be screened by a committee, which will score each application. The scoring points are listed next to each question in the application.

Up to five projects will be selected. Awards will vary from \$2,500 to \$7,500, depending on the level of detail and impact in the target population.

The selection criteria is listed in the application, including:

- The ability of the idea to meet the program goals
- Impact in the target population
- Experience and capacity executing similar work

#### STANDARD AGREEMENT

The selected contractor will be expected to sign a <u>Standard</u> <u>Agreement Form</u>
