January – March 2014

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INTRODUCTION

The Contract Compliance Division (CCD) monitors construction and development, commodities and supplies, and professional and technical services contracts by enforcing various local and federal civil rights and wage laws and policies. The CCD monitors city contracts to ensure that workers are treated fairly, and paid appropriate wages, and that minorities, women and low income business owners and workers have access to employment and contracting opportunities. The CCD is responsible for monitoring and ensuring compliance in five primary program areas: Affirmative Action Plans, the Small and Underutilized Business Program (SUBP); minority and female employment; Davis Bacon and prevailing wage; and HUD Section 3 contracting and employment.

The organizational and process redesign work begun in 2013 has continued to result in increased efficiencies, effectiveness and productivity – including quality control that has improved project close outs, development and implementation of a large project Equity Plan¹,

OUTREACH

During the 1st quarter 2014, staff engaged in the following outreach activities to enhance relationships with stakeholders:

- Staff met with developers awarded contracts for the single family homes projects (NSP, HOW, Green Homes North, NRP) and staff from Community Planning and Economic Development (CPED) to obtain feedback and discuss process changes relating to monthly employment activity reporting. The response from developers and CPED staff was overwhelmingly positive. Developers have fully welcomed and embraced the process changes.
- Target Center Renovation Project CCD developed an Equity Plan for both the Architectural/Engineering Design and Construction Manager at Risk contracts for this project. CCD, Minneapolis Convention Center and the City's partner, The Tegra Group hosted a Meet and Greet event for women and minority vendors that were identified with the ability to perform the scopes of work for the project and who are also certified in the MNUCP directory. The Meet and Greet event followed the pre-bid meeting tour and was a complete success.
- The Minnesota State Bar Association hosted a Continuing Legal Education (CLE) "Construction Industry Workforce and Targeted Business Goals." MDCR director, Velma Korbel was on the panel (along with Commissioner Kevin Lindsey, Minnesota Department of Human Rights; Alex Tittle, Equity Director, Minnesota Sports Facilities Authority, and Lynn Littlejohn, Director of Community Affairs, Mortenson Construction) and spoke to an audience of construction law attorneys. Contract Compliance Officers attended.
- The office of Lurie Besikof Lapidus and Company, LLP an accounting firm hosted the WBE
 Corporate Partner Panel, for WBE firms to learn about securing business with local corporations
 and public entities. Two Contract Compliance Officers were in attendance and reported back
 several unique concepts for the City's Supplier Diversity program.

¹In recognition of the glaring economic disparity between whites and people of color in Minneapolis and the region and to redress discrimination in the city's marketplace and in public contracting against women-owned and minority owned business enterprises and in employment of women and minorities the City has incorporated the use of Equity Plans for projects valued in excess of \$10M. The purpose of the Equity Plan is to promote local hiring, employment of women and members of minority communities and to establish goals for construction contracts to be awarded to women-owned and minority-owned businesses and goals for workforce participation.

- The 2014 Construction Kick Off event sponsored by the Metropolitan Council was attended by several Contract Compliance Officers. Highlights were presented by the Metropolitan Council Environmental Services and Metro Transit. Attendees heard from representatives from the US Department of Labor, Minnesota Department of Labor, and Minnesota Department of Human Rights.


TECHNOLOGY

Currently, CCD uses two systems to monitor projects. The Client Relationship Management system (CRM) is used as a project management tool, and LCPtracker is used to track prevailing wage and employment activity. CCD has been working closely with Information Technology to document CCD's compliance monitoring processes and identify areas for improved efficiency through an improved compliance monitoring tool. This research and documentation will be used to develop a new one-system compliance monitoring tool that will incorporate the activities of the current tools and integrate the City's finance information software.

MINORITY AND WOMEN INCLUSION

Small and Underutilized Business Program

72 active construction projects with a value of \$385,850,691



The Small and Underutilized Business Program (SUBP) ordinance, Chapter 423 of the Minneapolis City Code of Ordinances is enforced by the CCD. The SUBP ordinance is intended to redress discrimination in the City's Marketplace² and create opportunities for Minority-owned Business Enterprises (MBEs) and Women-owned Business Enterprises (WBEs). The CCD assists in leveling the playing field in City contracting by placing participation goals on City contracts.

Goals

SUBP goals are set for MBE and WBE participation on a contract-by-contract basis before the project or bid is advertised. The goals are set based on whether there are subcontracting opportunities and if there is an available pool of ready willing and able MBE/WBE subcontractors.

MBE/WBE firms are certified through the Minnesota Unified Certification Program (MNUCP) to perform within the scope of work on a contract. More information and applications are available online at www.MNUCP.org. Goals are set for the following:

- Commodities and supplies contracts valued over \$50,000
- Construction and development contracts valued over \$100,000
- Professional and technical services contracts valued over \$100,000

Bids are reviewed to determine whether the bidder met the project goals or made a good faith effort to do so. Bidders are responsible for making every reasonable and necessary effort to subcontract with MBEs/WBEs. Bids not meeting the project goals or making a good faith effort to do so will be deemed unresponsive and may be rejected.

There were 63 requests for SUBP goals this quarter:

Commodities and Supplies 32

Construction and Development 14

Professional and Technical 17

Supplier Diversity

The Supplier Diversity Program promotes utilization of women and minority owned businesses for public contracting. The intent of this model program is to provide City departments with the opportunity to engage local woman and minority owned businesses in providing goods and services for city contracts worth \$50,000 or less.

The combined City goal for W/MBEs is 25% (MBE – 12% and WBE – 13%).

CCD is working towards developing a new tracking system that will assist us in documenting these efforts.

² Only firms that have their principal place of business located within the City's Marketplace will count towards meeting SUBP goals.

The City's Marketplace consists of the geographical area of the Minnesota counties of Anoka, Carver, Chisago, Dakota, Hennepin, Isanti, Ramsey, Scott, Sherburne, Washington, and Wright.

Minnesota Unified Certification Program (MNUCP)

MBEs and WBEs must be certified through the MNUCP for their participation to count toward the SUBP goals. MNUCP is a small business certification program managed jointly by the City of Minneapolis, Minnesota Department of Transportation, Metropolitan Council, and the Metropolitan Airport Commission. The goal is to make it easier for qualified small business enterprises to participate in the contracting process by having one jurisdiction to apply for certification which covers multiple agencies. MNUCP certification fosters local participation, increases market exposure, and creates access to additional opportunities with participating jurisdictions.

The MNUCP is mandated by Title 49 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Part 26 and Part 23.

Certifying members of the MNUCP are the City of Minneapolis, Metropolitan Airports Commission (MAC), Metropolitan Council, and the Minnesota Department of Transportation (MnDOT). Designated CCD staff and staff from each certifying agency are specialists for the MNUCP who review applications and conduct on-sites for businesses applying for certification. Specialists then present the application to the Certification Application Committee of the MNUCP for approval or denial of the application. The CAC consists of specialists from each certifying agency. The chair of the CAC rotates between agencies annually. The 2014 CAC is being hosted by the City and the chair is the CCD division director. Noncertifying members of the MNUCP are all other government entities in Minnesota that receive US Department of Transportation

Non-certifying members are other government entities in Minnesota that participate only as recipients of the certifying process.

Eligibility Requirements

- Business must be owned at least 51% by a socially and economically disadvantaged individual(s)
- Owner(s) is a U.S. citizen or lawfully admitted permanent resident of the United States
- Business meets Small Business Administration (SBA) size standard requirements, and the personal net worth of the disadvantaged owner does not exceed \$1.32 million
- The socially and economically disadvantaged owner(s) controls the business and has directly related managerial and technical competence and experience


Certification is valid for two (2) calendar years following the date of approval.

Affirmative Action


An affirmative action plan ("AAP") is a combination of policies and procedures a company utilizes to prohibit discrimination and promote employment opportunities for women, minorities and disabled individuals.

Minneapolis Ordinance 139.50(d) requires that every contractor entering into a contract with the City of Minneapolis in excess of \$50,000 have an approved affirmative action plan on file with the Minneapolis Department of Civil Rights prior to entering into a contract with the City. CCD assists companies in developing their AAPs and processes all AAPs submitted.

Other considerations are as follows:

- Affirmative Action Plans already approved by the Department will be valid until their expiration date.
- Plans approved by the Department expire three (3) years after the date of approval.
- The City requests and processes plans for companies with direct contracts with the City of Minneapolis.
- The Department will accept current plans approved by the Minnesota Department of Human Rights (MDHR), the Minnesota Mechanical Contractors Association (MMCA), the National Electrical Contractors Association (NECA) and the City of St. Paul, provided the MDCR receives a copy of the plan and corresponding certificate of approval.

In the first quarter of 2014, fifty-nine (59) affirmative action plans were approved, with over half of the plans being from the City of Minneapolis.

SECTION 3

The HUD Section 3 program is an income based certification that takes into account the household income of either a worker or of the primary business owner. The CCD currently has 57 businesses certified as Section 3, with none currently pending certification. The CCD certified 182 members of the Minneapolis Building Trades and local unions as Section 3 residents, with three more pending.

SINGLE FAMILY HOMES


Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP)

The federal Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP) was established through Housing and Urban Development (HUD) in order to stabilize foreclosure-challenged communities. This program utilizes federal, state and City of Minneapolis funding to purchase and/or rehabilitate foreclosed or abandoned properties. In addition to the goal of restoring these communities, such as North Minneapolis which was particularly affected by the foreclosure crisis, the City encourages contractors to (1) contract with small underutilized businesses, (2) promote the city's female and minority workforce goals and (3) hire Section 3 businesses and Minneapolis residents that meet HUD's income-based requirements.


NSP was divided into 3 separate programs NSP1, NSP2 and NSP3, all of which have been incredibly successful residential housing programs. Currently, 8 developers are involved: Alliance Housing, City of Lakes Community Land Trust, Greater Metropolitan Housing Corporation, Twin Cities Habitat for Humanity, Neighborhood Housing Services, Powderhorn Residents Group, Project for Pride in Living and Urban Homeworks. Two of the larger projects developed by Alliance Housing and Project for Pride in Living are million dollar projects offering multi-family housing options to the North Minneapolis


community and evidence the fact that Minneapolis businesses are dedicated to preserving and promoting affordable housing.

NSP1 currently has 1 active remaining project, NSP2 has 19 active projects and NSP3 has 13 active projects. In total NSP is currently building and/or rehabilitating 32 single- and multi-family residences. The original NSP1 program is winding down with a majority of the developers near completion of their projects, but the NSP2 and NSP3 programs are expected to remain active for the remainder of the calendar year.



Contractors are successfully meeting the challenge of the recently increased employment goals for City of Minneapolis projects effective May 1, 2012. Projects beginning January 1, 2013 were expected to meet to 6% female and 32% minority workforce participation (skilled/unskilled combined) goals. Of a total 257,385.01 NSP project hours, 127,682.00 hours were NSP1 projects, 103,885.31 were NSP2 projects and 25,817.70 have been worked on NSP3 projects. For NSP 1, approximately 8,900 hours were female workforce, and 93,100 hours were minority workforce. For NSP2 projects, approximately 10,152.66 hours were female workforce and 56,762.06 hours were minority workforce. For NSP3 projects, 1,805 hours were female workforce and 15,298 hours were minority workforce.





Green Homes North

Green Homes North is an initiative of the City of Minneapolis and several partners which will build 100 energy efficient homes over five years to revitalize neighborhoods in North Minneapolis. Launched in 2012, funding has been awarded to nine developers to build 47 homes to date. Most of these homes will be completed and available for purchase in 2013 and 2014.

There are currently 23 homes currently under construction.

Home Ownership Works Program (HOW)

The City offers homebuyers the opportunity to purchase homes, either remodeled, older homes or newly built, through the Home Ownership Works Program (HOW). Minneapolis HOW homes are for sale at affordable prices and to those homebuyers with incomes below 80% of the metropolitan median income.

There are currently 9 active HOW project

WAGE UNDERPAYMENTS AND RESTITUTIONS

CCD staff monitors contractors to ensure timely payroll submission and that accurate wages are paid to all workers on publicly funded construction projects, as governed by the enforcement of the Federal Davis-Bacon Act and City Prevailing Wage ordinance. CCD identifies, investigates and calculates wage underpayments that occur on these projects. Investigative issues are as follows: blatant wage underpayments, identifying workers not being reported as working on projects, misclassification of onsite workers and various types of miscalculation of wages and overtime pay.

100% of wage underpayments have been resolved.

CONCLUSION

Going forward CCD will continue to work with the Information Technology Department to research and develop new compliance monitoring technology. CCD will also continue the organizational and process redesign.
