
From April 25-May 21, 2022 Solid Waste & Recycling completed a waste characterization and capture rate study of single-family homes. Garbage, recycling and organics carts were exchanged at 700 randomly selected single-family homes in the city to be sorted into 55 different categories. A cart hanger was left at the randomly selected homes to inform the resident they were a part of the study. The cart hanger had a QR code to an optional 5 question survey to provide additional information on how waste is managed at the home.

A total of 57 households completed the survey (8.1% response rate). These are the results of the optional survey.


What is the most common way you dispose of these items




Most common disposal method - food and household items

Batteries

- 2 respondents reported putting batteries (alkaline and rechargeable in their recycling cart)
- 1 respondent reported putting alkaline batteries in their recycling . cart and bringing rechargeable batteries to a drop-off site
- Garbage cart: 45% alkaline, 13% rechargeable .
- Drop-off: 42% alkaline, 61% rechargeable .
- N/A, Other: 7% alkaline, 22% rechargeable




How often do you do the following?




