

Boulevard Maintenance Notice



This fall, Minneapolis Public Works mowed some boulevard areas along Bryant Avenue. This was done as the vegetation either exceeded 30 inches tall, was considered weeds, or invasive plants.

The boulevard along Bryant Avenue was originally planted with salt-tolerant sod as part of the street reconstruction. Maintenance of boulevard sod is the adjacent property owner's responsibility. We did this one-time mowing at select properties to bring vegetation to a manageable height for your care next spring.

In addition to mowing boulevards, we also mowed the rain garden basins, which will be restored and replanted this spring. For more details, visit our project webpage.

While rain garden basins are considered Green Stormwater Infrastructure and will be managed by Public Works, all remaining boulevard maintenance is the responsibility of the adjacent property owner(s). If you would like to plant something in the boulevard, allowed plantings include sod, turfgrass, and flowers less than 36 inches tall (less than 18 inches tall if within 20 feet of a driveway, alley, or intersection).

If you had plantings other than sod in the boulevard, they were not harmed as no herbicide was applied. Fall mowing is standard maintenance for our boulevard native plantings.
