COOPERATIVE TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM



INTRODUCTION

The City of Minneapolis is seeking proposals from local non-profit and business consultants to provide direct business technical assistance to co-operatives located in Minneapolis. The total funding available in this solicitation is \$75,000 and we expect to award it to multiple consultants. During the contracting process the selected consultants and the City will agree upon the contract outcomes and deliverables. These will be outcome-based contracts for up to two years. Consultants will submit quarterly invoices in accordance with the terms of their contracts. Payments are based on the successful completion of the outcomes.

PROJECT BACKGROUND

In 2016, the City of Minneapolis expanded its Business Technical Assistance Program (B-TAP) to include services aimed at supporting the development of new Minneapolis co-operatives by launching the <u>Co-operative Technical Assistance Program (C-TAP)</u>.

At this time, the City is seeking proposals from experts in the co-op and business assistance fields to create a pool of consultants that will provide training and technical assistance services to new and existing co-ops. There would be two to four training sessions per year and the technical assistance would be on-demand. Non-profit organizations, small businesses, and individual professionals are welcome to respond to this solicitation.

C-TAP GOALS

The City aims to leverage the co-op model for maximum community benefit to:

- Act as an economic development tool to reduce poverty and promote social cohesion.
- Increase racial and ethnic diversity, and community ownership.
- Support innovation, community building, and local investment by encouraging a more collaborative business model.

TARGET POPULATION

The training and technical assistance is targeted at, but not limited to, the following audiences:

- Groups interested in forming a co-op
- Existing co-ops in the early stages of formation
- Low-income individuals and minorities looking to start a co-op

PROFESIONAL SERVICES SOLICITATION

1. The City is looking to create a pool of consultants to provide training and technical assistance services to Minneapolis co-ops. The trainings will be based on existing curriculum already created for the C-TAP program. The technical assistance will be responsive to the needs of specific co-ops and limited to the activities listed on pages 5 and 6. The funding available, the unit price, and expected outcomes are as follows:

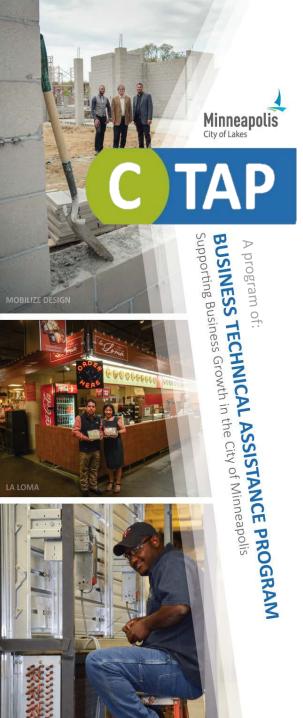

STEP 1: Co-ops Feasibility Training

CO-OP TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Feasibility Training and Basic Coaching

The selected consultant will offer an 8-week training (2 hours per week) for groups interested in creating a cooperative. We are particularly interested in consultants with cultural competency working with minority populations. The class will equip the participants with tools to evaluate their co-op idea and/or to refine their model for those already in the process of incorporation. Participants will create a co-op profile to evaluate the feasibility of their idea. A curriculum will be provided by the City of Minneapolis (here). Approximately 30 participants per class.

Session 3: Business plan and sustainability

Session 4: Building the democratic community and co-op feasibility study

Session 5: Focus on financials

Session 6: Cooperative governance

STEP 2: Technical Assistance for Start-up Co-ops

CO-OP TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Refining and Implementing the Co-op Business Idea

The selected consultant will provide one-on-one consultation to refine the participants' coop business ideas and take the appropriate steps to implement them. C-TAP will pay up to \$2,500 for each of the eligible activities listed below, up to \$5,000 for each co-op group. The City will match prospective co-op groups with consultants according to the group's specific needs and stage of development. To be reimbursed, City staff will request a technical assistance report. Eligible co-ops will have completed the Step 1 co-op training and/or co-op profile. Co-op groups must operate within the City of Minneapolis.

Eligible Technical Assistance for Start-up Co-ops

Selected service providers will provide one or more of the following services:

- Business plan writing
- Legal services including incorporation, bylaws, etc.
- Financial feasibility, loan packaging and financial sustainability
- Member recruitment and community engagement
- Cooperative governance and board training
- Organizational structure
- Physical space layout, site selection, and negotiation
- Marketing and customer service
- Other

Budget

\$2,500 for each activity, up to \$5,000 (or 2 activities) for each co-op. Indicate any leveraged funding. Total available funding for this step is \$35,000.00 and we expect to award it to multiple consultants.





STEP 3: Technical Assistance for Existing Co-ops

CO-OP TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

Sustaining and Expanding the Co-op Business

The selected consultant will provide one-on-one consultation to existing co-ops so they can sustain operations and/or prepare for expansion. Eligible co-ops need to have be in operations for at least two years and be located within the City of Minneapolis. Eligible co-ops will contact C-TAP staff in order to receive services. C-TAP staff will review the eligibility and match them according to the group's needs with a consultant to receive the services.

Eligible Technical Assistance for Existing Co-ops

Selected service providers will provide one or more of the following services:

- Marketing plan development
- Legal and regulatory services
- Strategic plan development
- Business plan writing
- Member recruitment and community engagement
- Cooperative governance and board training
- Organizational structure
- Physical space layout, site selection, and negotiation
- Other

Budget

\$100.00 per hour, up to 25 hours per co-op. Indicate any leveraged funding. Total available funding for this step is \$15,000.00 and we expect to award it to multiple consultants.





INTRODUCTION TO C-TAP: Cooperative Technical Assistance Program

Program design: Steps

- **STEP 1:** Co-op Feasibility Class
 - For groups thinking of forming a co-op and needing a clearer picture of the legal, operational and organizational requirements. Participants will create a co-op feasibility profile.
- STEP 2: Technical assistance for start up co-ops. Refining and implementing the co-op idea
 - Coaching and consultant services will be provided to co-ops to redefine and implement their co-op idea. Existing co-ops and participants of the "co-op readiness training" may be eligible for this service.
- STEP 3: Technical assistance for existing co-ops. Sustaining and expanding the co-op business
 - Business consulting services will be provided to design plans and systems to help the co-op sustain operations and prepare for expansion.
