Public Case Synopses

January 2016

Outcome		Description
1	Sent to coaching - no coaching or policy violation	5-105(2): Professional Code of Conduct Complainant alleges she called police several times to get help for her son who was stabbed. She alleges that her husband went to the scene to be with her son, and tried to flag down officers but was told if there isn't a problem they couldn't help. Complainant alleges it feels like no one cares.
2	Dismissed – no basis	5-105(3): Professional Code of Conduct Complainant alleges Officer 1 is helping a known adult black male use the law to harass him. Complainant "feels very strongly" that Officer 1 is either letting himself be used, or is using racial favoritism, while complainant is repeatedly victimized by the known adult black male. Complainant also alleges "police" have added to his problem by breaking a rear door window on one occasion and the front door lower window on a second occasion, in an attempt to enter his apartment.
3	Dismissed – no basis	5-105(2): Professional Code of Conduct Complainant reported she called Officer 1 to follow up on a report she had filed. Complainant alleges Officer 1 told her that her case was not important enough to be assigned. Complainant alleges Officer 1 stated that "he feels the incident reported did not take place at the daycare" and made the complainant feel like she was lying about the incident that took place.
4	Sent to coaching – no coaching or policy violation	5-105(2): Professional Code of Conduct Complainant alleges officers were called by her landlord. Complainant alleges two female officers arrived, and one made a smart comment to her husband. Complainant alleges the officer asked why Complainant had an attitude, and the younger officer stated the landlord 'does not want you here'. Complainant alleges an officer stated she was in mediation because of them. Complainant alleges she asked for a blue card and a police report and was not given either. Complainant alleges she tried to report the incident to the precinct, and the desk officer said he would take care of it with a smirk.
5	Dismissed – no jurisdiction	7-401: Normal Vehicle Operation Complainant reported that a police car was speeding at about 60mph. Complainant reported the police car was responding to an emergency, and alleges the police car almost hit his car and could have killed him and could have caused an accident.
6	Sent to coaching – officer coached, no policy violation	5-105(14): Professional Code of Conduct Complainant alleges Officer 1 was rude to multiple pedestrians while directing traffic at a parking garage. The Complainant alleges the officer provided no guidance to pedestrians and was sarcastic and rude when pedestrians would take the natural right way. Complainant alleges he could not see his badge number, but when asked was gruffly asked why.
7	Sent to coaching – officer coached, no policy violation	7-401: Normal Vehicle Operation Complainant alleges she was stopped at red light when a she witnessed a police truck and horse trailer cut across two lanes behind her and attempt to get past her vehicle to make a right turn. When there was not enough space to get past her vehicle, Complainant alleges the officer screamed at her to "Move up" so he could get past her.
8	Sent to coaching – no coaching or policy violation	5-105(14): Professional Code of Conduct Complainant alleges he called the police because someone spit in his eye. Complainant alleges he told the officers he needed his eyes flushed and was told to calm the f*** down and sit down. Complainant alleges the officer asked if Complainant wanted something else, like mace, in his eye. Complainant alleges the officer said "we don't give a f*** we need your information to make sure you didn't have any warrants, when the Complainant tried to explain his situation. Complainant alleges the officer told him to sit the f*** down motherf*** and let us do our jobs motherf***.

9	Sent to investigation, dismissed – failure to cooperate	<p>5-105(2): Professional Code of Conduct Complainant alleged she was arrested and was questioned without her Miranda Warning. Complainant was arrested again for violation of an OFP that had been placed on her while jailed on the prior arrest. Complainant alleges officers gave her home away and their repeated actions of arresting her cost her job. Complainant alleges had Officer 1 done his job, she wouldn't be in the situation she is in. Complainant alleges Officer 1 complained to her that he was tired of coming to the property and threatened to take her to jail for sitting at another property.</p>
10	Sent to coaching – coaching, no policy violation	<p>5-105(14): Professional Code of Conduct Complainant alleges he was in the bathroom when officers broke into his apartment with the old tenant who claimed he was there to get some personal items. Complainant alleges he wasn't sure who it was and came out of the bathroom with a knife. Complainant then alleges officers handcuffed him. Complainant alleges he asked the officers what they were doing and was told to shut the f*** up or they would take him to jail. Complainant alleges one officer walked with the former tenant through the apartment to the basement. Complainant alleges after the tenant was allowed to walk through the apartment, his keys were missing.</p>
