Complainant also claims that the guard called the resident a "b****h" and then started choking her after the resident attempted to get her ID badge and phone back from the security guard's pockets. As he was choking the resident, Complainant claims that she pulled on the security guard's hoodie in order to get him to stop; as result of pulling on his hoodie, Complainant contends that the guard fell and told her, "So that's the way you want it. You want some, too." Complainant claims that she was able to call 911 in regards to the alleged assault and two officersOfficers 1 and 2came to assist. However, Complainant asserts that the officers disregarded her complaint and instead belittled her, saying in reference to her that "if someone refuses a breathalyzer[,]you can be sure they've been drinking." Complainant contends that this statement was made after she refused to do a breathalyzer because the incident was due to the security guard's actions and not her own.	
		Complainant also asserts that the Officer 1 wanted her and the residentwho were in the process of being kicked out from the shelterto wait out in the "coldin pajamas, no socks, no coat" as a staff member gathered her and the other resident's belongings. Complainant contends that she refused the shelter's mandate to leave as she felt her eviction was unjustified. Also, Complainant claims that, as she was ushered up to her room to retrieve her belongings by the shelter staff, Officer 1 said, "[M]ake it quick, I'm tired of
