Summary of Survey Responses

This document summarizes responses to the survey and open houses for the City of Minneapolis' neighborhood traffic calming projects in 2023. Postcards were sent out to properties near the project areas in advance of the open houses to notify residents. The survey was posted on the City's website and advertised through the postcard. The survey was open for responses between May 22, 2023, and June 14, 2023. 














Summary of self-reported demographics of survey respondents.


Gender Identity



Age




Racial Identity
