## Non-Public Case Synopses

	Outcome	Description
1	Sent to coaching, officers coached and policy violation found	5-105(A)(3) Professional Code of Conduct It is alleged that Officer 1 referred to a recruit as a "motherfucker" on multiple occasions.
2	Dismissed, no basis	5-105(E)(2) Professional Code of Conduct Complainant states that a burglar was in his backyard at two in the morning and he chased him away. According to Complainant, he called 911, explained the situation and was told that officers would soon be arriving. However, Complainant asserts that officers never came or even passed by.
3	Sent to investigation, cleared by exception	2-501(III)(E) MPD In-Service Training It is alleged that the officer failed to complete mandatory training absent an excuse.
4	Dismissed, no basis	5-105(A)(4) Professional Code of Conduct Complainant alleges that, after he had been placed into custody, his phone was not returned to him.
5	Sent to investigation, withdrawn	5-102.01 Minnesota Law Enforcement Code of Ethics It is alleged that the officer has committed a criminal act.
6	Sent to investigation, sent to coaching, no coaching or policy violation	5-104.01 Professional Policing Complainant states that an officer "violated [his] civil rights and conducted illegal vehicle search" when he removed "legal documents from [his] glove box compartment inside [his] vehicle without [his] consent" nor "probable cause."
7	Dismissed, no basis	5-104.01 Professional Policing Complainant alleges that he tried to advise officers that his neighbor's car should not be towed as she had a permit--though expired--hanging on the vehicle. Complainant contends that no car should be towed prior to the updating of permits the next day. Further, Complainant attempted to explain to the officers that his neighbor does not speak English well. Nonetheless, Complainant asserts that the officers disregarded the "facts." Complainant asserts in particular that one of the officers was "unprofessional" and "arrogant" when interacting with him and his neighbor.
8	Dismissed, no basis	5-105(A)(4) Professional Code of Conduct Complainant contends that she was stopped by an officer for not having her head lights on and was later asked to do sobriety tests. After the tests, Complainant claims that the officer put her into his squad and threatened to take her to jail. However, Complainant asserts that she requested another officer at the scene, and she was eventually let go after re-doing the tests.  Upon being let go, Complainant contends that the officer failed to give her back her license and insurance.
9	Dismissed, no basis	5-105(E)(2) Professional Code of Conduct Complainant alleges that officers failed to write a report after he told them that he had been stalked by several unknown individuals who planted a GPS device on his car.
10	Sent to investigation, withdrawn	5-104.01 Professional Policing Complainant asserts that she is a nurse at a local hospital and was assisting a patient file a police report when, during the course of the reporting, an officer accused the patient of having "quite the record." She also claims that the officer "used a tone throughout suggesting that [her] patient was a perpetrator, not a victim." Complainant additionally comments that the patient was a "Native woman."
