		Complainant asserts that he was arrested by police though all he wanted to do was
		go to bed. While being placed in handcuffs, Complainant contends that he professed
		his innocence to the officers and also told them that his handcuffs were too tight and
		that he has diabetes. After the incident, Complainant, who asserts he is elderly,
		contends that he still has bruises and scars from the handcuffs.

	Basis	Complainant alleges that he was struck by a vehicle and it attempted to flee;
		Complainant claims that he called 911 for this reason. However, upon responding to
		the accident, Complainant asserts that officers alleged that his car smelled like
		marijuana, to which Complainant stated that it likely smelled like sage due to his
		girlfriend using the vehicle earlier to go to a sweat lodge. Nonetheless, Complainant
		claims that the officer "ripped [him]" from his car and handcuffed him; he also
		asserts that his passenger was handcuffed as well.
		Also, Complainant asserts that he repeatedly asked for an ambulance and for a
		supervisor but neither came. Complainant asserts that his back and neck were hurt
		and had to walk in this condition. Eventually, Complainant alleges that officers let
		him go but told him to grab his stuff and leave or he would be arrested.
		Lastly, Complainant claims that his vehicle was searched through by officers but
		they did not find anything.
