September 23, 2014 – 6:00PM – A presentation on the current training provided to the department (Academy level and ongoing development) regarding Stop and Frisk policy and procedure. This should also include the current reporting requirements, system(s) used and capabilities.

Sample questions to consider for presentation/discussion:

- When are stops required to be documented?
- What is the process for updating training materials to reflect changes in case law?

September 23, 2014 – 6:00PM – A presentation from the perspective of a shift supervisor (Sgt.) on stop and frisk situations and what determines the need for documentation of a stop that does not lead to arrest.

Sample questions to consider for presentation/discussion:

- Officer discretion in documentation
- What systems are available?
- Procedure and time requirement?
- If more reporting were required, what are the potential impediments or problem areas?
- Problems based on Precinct/Time of Day? (i.e. 1st Precinct at bar close)
