Environmental assessments suggest that these toxic compounds continue to leach into the soil and contaminate the local aquifers. Most recent work has been the Roundhouse ReUse Study, which involved the community in a planning vision for the neighborhood to have living-wage jobs, urban style Central Ave. with green space, high-density mixed use development, and historic preservation.
