2020 CENSUS

We Count Minneapolis is the City's tag line for the 2020 Census. The U.S. Census is a count of all residents in the United States taken every 10 years and is required by the U.S. Constitution. It is used to determine political representation and federal funding distribution for governments, including at the state and local levels. In 2020, it will determine how many congressional representatives Minnesota will have for the next decade. Getting an accurate and complete count of all residents is vital.

OFFICE OF IMMIGRANT AND REFUGEE AFFAIRS (OIRA)

OIRA was created in 2018 and is housed within the NCR Department. Minneapolis office is one of about twenty offices dedicated to our Immigrant and Refugee residents in the U.S. The principal responsibilities are to:

- Inform City leaders about federal immigration developments and advise on policy initiatives to support affected residents.
- Equip community members with information regarding immigration developments, positioning them to protect and defend their rights.
- Educate residents about existing resources to address immigration issues and other needs, whether through local government or through legal, social service or other nonprofit organizations.

An upcoming event the office is coordinating along with City and community leaders is Welcoming Week Celebration, which will be held on **September 20, 2019** from **2-6:30 p.m.** at Powderhorn Park. The celebrations goal is for families to have fun, celebrate, learn about each other and to create safe and welcoming spaces for immigrants and refugees in Minneapolis.
