This class is not designed for housing cooperatives.

- Groups interested in starting a cooperative business in Minneapolis.
- Groups and business owners interested in converting an existing business to a cooperative.
- Groups with a minimum of 2 to 3 people (not for individuals).
- Commitment of one person from each group to attend all sessions.

- Session 2: Development pathways for co-op startups; presentation of the Cooperative Ownership Canvas.
- Session 3: Review of ownership discussion; presentation and discussion of the Business Model Canvas in a cooperative context.
- Session 4: Cooperative law and finance: Presentations and panel discussion on key aspects of cooperative law and finance.

- Session 6 (Optional): Content specifically related to the conversion of an existing business to cooperative ownership.
