

African American Community Briefing, Wednesday May 20, 2:00 pm

PURPOSE: The City will share important COVID-19 information with and gather input from community members, leaders and stakeholders about their communities' needs and priorities so that we can respond appropriately and ensure that our communities know where to access the correct information. This input will also shape how the City shares information with the public.

City update of COVID-19 response

- Health Gretchen Musicant
 - o Gretchen started by stressing that the Health Department continues to maintain and coordinate a wide variety of City resources and information related to the COVID-19 pandemic response.
 - In an answer regarding the availability of masks, she and Heather Gillich, Policy and Advocacy
 Specialist, noted that there will be another mask drive this Memorial Day, from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm, at fire stations throughout the city,
 - The Health Department, working with community partners and organizations, will continue to match the supplies and resources to the needs as the Pandemic response progresses.
 - The Health Department Shared Power Advisory Committee is currently working on a BIPOC impact report.
 - Luisa Pessoa-Brandao, Research Specialist, provided information about how contact tracing is moving along. Until recently, the State Health Department has carried most of the contact tracing process. Now local Health Departments, including Minneapolis, are helping. The people who test positive receive staff follow-up. This includes asking each individual about their social and workplace contacts, providing them with info they can share if they choose to, and indicating that the Health Department can handle it anonymously if an individual is concerned about exposing any of their personal information

- Gap Funding small business Eric Hansen
 - Community Planning and Economic Development (CPED) will be offering forgivable 0% interest loans for small businesses
 - \$5,000 \$10,000 per loan
 - o Areas of concentrated poverty including the Promise Zone, the Green Zone
 - o 1,200 apps by April 20 800 eligible

- City able to cover \$1.8 million
- o 150 to 250 businesses
- Demographic profile of recipients this week
- "Reopening the Economy" update businesses are not required, but able to open
 Governor and Mayor will address this in the next few days, stressing how we keep people safe
 - Workers are not required to return if sick or unable
 - Balance between health and economic needs
 - Form for input added to session chat.

Gap Funding rent assistance

- The Community Planning and Economic Development (CPED) Department received 8,000 applications by end of April. After initial review, 6,500 of these applications were deemed eligible under the program guidelines.
- The City is only able to fund about 3,000 of these applications.
- City staff have been sending messages out to each of the applicants to let them know the status
 of their application along with information on how to access other resources.
- As applicants are approved checks will be issued on a weekly basis
- o Andrea Inouye (Mayor's Office) has been working with Andrea Brennan of CPED
- Hennepin County will open a \$15 Million Housing Gap Fund for residents of Minneapolis not previously available in MPLS

Hennepin County rental assistance funding will open for Minneapolis residents later this month. Check the website at https://www.hennepin.us/residents/human-services/emergency-rental-covid19. Hennepin County – additional resources coming soon

Residents renting anywhere in Hennepin County may be eligible for part of an additional \$15 million that will be released later in May. We'll update this page when those funds become available.

- Eligibility You may be eligible if you:
- Rent your housing in Hennepin County
- Have household income below 50% of the area median income (about \$46,550 for a household of three)
- Lost income due to COVID-19
- Can't afford housing costs this month
- Are not receiving Section 8 or other ongoing rental assistance
- Priority will be given to households with incomes below 30% of the area median income, and those that are ineligible for Unemployment Insurance.
