Minneapolis Youth Works

Funded via the Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA); Minneapolis Youth Works helps youth and young adults learn academic, life, and work skills, identify career paths, and achieve meaningful employment. The program emphasis is serving out-of-school young adults ages 16-24.

The agencies above will provide 350 Minneapolis youth with comprehensive, case managed employment and training services during PY'17 (April 1, 2017-March, 31, 2018): American Indian OIC (40), East Side Neighborhood Services (40), EMERGE (32), HIRED (95), Pillsbury United Communities @ Waite House (48) and RESOURCE (95).

BUILD Leaders

BUILD Leaders serves young adults ages 18-24, focusing on American Indian youth in South Minneapolis and African American youth in North Minneapolis. This innovative program assists young adults to enhance their employment readiness, develop fundamental job skills and create healthier cycles and habits. BUILD Leaders also receive paid training in facilitation and leadership to deliver the BUILD youth violence prevention curriculum to 9-12 year olds at various locations in Minneapolis.

- In 2016, twenty-two young adults participated in BUILD Leaders. Twenty earned industry recognized occupational credentials and nineteen completed paid internship experiences.
- American Indian OIC (in partnership with Little Earth of United Tribes) launched their 2nd cohort in March and EMERGE began 2nd cohort activities in April.

Minneapolis Teen Job and Opportunity Fair

- On Saturday, April 22, more than 350 teens attended the eleventh annual Minneapolis Teen Job Fair.
- The pre-event Prep Rally helped teens refine resumes, apply on-line, and sharpen their interview skills.
- The Youth Coordinating Board's employment committee facilitated an employer panel that answered questions and shared employer insights.
- Multiple sectors were represented, including retail, nonprofit, entertainment, health care and the public sector.

- Home Depot, TJMaxx, Wendy's, UPS, Valley Fair, North Memorial Health Care, Minneapolis Park and Recreation Board, and Hennepin County were among the exhibitors.
- Volunteer, education and internship opportunities were also promoted.

PEACE (Pathways to Emergency & Academy Career Experiences)

- PEACE has 43/50 students enrolled and participating
- 33 students will participate in a summer JES internship. 22 are PEACE recruited internships and 11 are STEP-UP recruited internships
- All 43 students will have access to career academies through our partners
- FBI, MFD, MPD, CAO, Hennepin County & HCMC will all host career academies that provide students with 8-12 hours of experience in their departments. US Bank Stadium will provide a security tour for students this summer.
- We have 26 recruited mentors. We are always looking for more mentors so if you are aware of any please invite them to reach out to us for opportunities to mentor. It's a 2-hour/month commitment.
- We've had really good success and turnout with PEACE events from students, mentors and partners.

STEP-UP

- Achieve is currently placing youth in internships and hopes to have everyone in place by the end of the month.
- Discover just hosted 2 days of Intakes at the Convention Center and placed around 500 jobs and has re-scheduled intakes this weekend at 800 W. Broadway to place the rest of available jobs.
- Explore sites are just completing the intake process and will serve around 180 youth.
- The STEP-UP overall placement goal is 1,675.
